Welcome to the next edition of the SWARF newsletter.


Time flies when you're having fun, so let's get into it!

## **Latest Info**

Sunday running has been plentiful, with the clubs' Bank account getting a healthy dose of the action each week. The Wab has been the star of the show most weeks, with the Ec standing in for it on the few weeks the Wab doesn't run.

The club is currently planning a new loco to supplement the Ec. It is definite that it will be powered by an Electric-Start Petrol Engine; however we are tossing up between Hydraulics or Electrics. It is almost certain it will come out looking like a NZR Dsc class loco. This was chosen for the Centre-Cab as it is the ideal location for the engine, and with the bonnets on both sides provides ample room for anything else required.

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Ben has made substantial progress on his new loco. It is currently sitting in Ted Barnes' workshop getting the controller wired in, and once this is complete, the mount for it will be made up. Then comes the body-work...

The suspension has since been changed to a piece of foam, obtained from the local Aquatic Centre. This came in a long strip around 500mm long by 70mm wide. About 2 strokes with a hacksaw blade and the below was produced. A hole in the middle of the piece was hand-turned with a 10mm drill to locate it on the screw on-top of the Axlebox...





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Ben has been continuing the '2-Ridecar laps', not only at NPSMEE, but also at other tracks. Ben had 2 on for nearly 20 laps of the HME Tracks...



Ben has also kept track of the Km's that are being done on the Eb. So far he has done 397.71kms since 30<sup>th</sup> December last year. Hate to think how many it has done since completion in 2009. Must be over 1500km!
